Shisper glacier flood devastates PoGB, blocks Karakoram highway and isolates communities

AGENCY GILGIT : Intense flooding caused by the release of water and soil erosion from the Hunza Shisper Glacier has caused significant damage in the area, blocking the Karakoram Highway (KKH) and isolating communities in Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Balistan, as reported by Samaa TV. Local authorities have stated that the critical KKH has been entirely obstructed, hindering trade between Pakistan and China while halting all local transport. An alternative route has been established for smaller vehicles, but heavy traffic remains trapped. In Hassanabad, water from the glacier has inundated homes that were previously evacuated by officials. A hotel has been damaged, and numerous trees have been swept away. Agricultural land in Hunza and Shigar has also suffered devastation, significantly impacting local farmers. Faizullah Faraz, spokesperson for the Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Balistan government, confirmed that floodwaters have also reached Shigar in Balistan, damaging fields, standing crops, and irrigation channels. He remarked, "Gilgit-Balistan is experi-

encing a catastrophic flood disaster," adding that over 50 labourers narrowly escaped the rising waters, as reported by Samaa TV. The flooding has not only destroyed homes and farmland but has also ruined electricity poles and fibre optic cables, affecting communication services in the impacted regions. Large rocks and landslides continue to fall on the Silk Road, posing additional risks for rescue efforts. The KKH at Hunza remains blocked, leaving travellers stranded. Authorities have vowed to commence road repair work shortly, according to Samaa TV. Volunteers who attempted to restore water channels in perilous conditions miraculously survived. Meanwhile, residents are facing shortages of essential supplies, as access to the area is severely limited. The situation is being monitored closely, but with the glacier discharge persisting, the potential for further flooding remains high, as the Samaa TV report indicated. Disasters driven by climate change continue to afflict Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Balistan, as a glacial lake outburst flood (GLOF) from the Shisper Glacier surged through Has-

sanabad Nullah, damaging a portion of the Karakoram Highway and destroying both public and private property, according to Dawn. Officials have characterised this event as the most severe in the region since 2018. "The water volume during today's flood

was the highest recorded in the Nullah since 2018," stated Zubair Ahmed Khan, assistant director of the Gilgit-Balistan Disaster Management Authority (GBDMA) for Hunza and Nagar, as reported by Dawn. Agricultural areas in Hunza and Shigar have

been particularly hard-hit, with standing crops, irrigation channels, and fertile land destroyed. "Gilgit-Balistan is experiencing a catastrophic flood disaster," said Faizullah Faraz, spokesperson for the regional administration, adding that more than 50

labourers narrowly escaped the surging waters. The flooding has also knocked down electricity poles, damaged fibre optic cables, and disrupted communications. On the Silk Road, falling rocks and ongoing landslides have complicated rescue and relief

operations. The KKH remains closed in Hunza, leaving travellers stranded while authorities pledge to begin repairs soon. Volunteers attempting to restore water channels in hazardous conditions managed to survive without injury. With access routes blocked, residents are facing shortages of food, medicine, and other essentials. Officials warn that the risk of further flooding remains high as the glacier continues to discharge water. Dawn reports that this disaster was caused by a glacial lake outburst flood (GLOF) from the Shisper Glacier, which tore through Hassanabad Nullah and damaged a section of the KKH, along with public and private infrastructure. Authorities have called it the worst flood-

ing the region has seen since 2018. "The water flow today was the highest recorded in the Nullah since 2018," confirmed Zubair Ahmed Khan, assistant director of the Gilgit-Balistan Disaster Management Authority for Hunza and Nagar. Severe flooding triggered by the release of water and soil erosion from the Hunza Shisper Glacier has caused widespread destruction in Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Balistan, cutting off communities and disrupting a critical trade route with China. According to Samaa TV, the Karakoram Highway (KKH) — a vital artery connecting Pakistan to China — has been completely blocked

NYC Democratic candidate Mamdani holds strong lead in mayoral race, shows new poll

NEW YORK: The democratic primary, Zohran Mamdani has emerged as the frontrunner in New York City's mayoral race, leading by a significant margin in a crowded five-person contest. The Hill reported on Tuesday (local time). According to The Hill, citing a new Siena College poll, Mamdani has 44 per cent support among registered voters in New York, placing him 19 points ahead of former New York Governor Andrew Cuomo, who comes in second with 25 per cent. Republican nominee Curtis Sluiwa trails with 12 per cent, while current Mayor Eric Adams garners just 7 per cent support. Cuomo, who lost the Democratic primary to Mamdani in June, and Adams, who skipped the primary altogether, are both still registered Democrats but are running independent campaigns in the general election. The Hill reported. Among registered Democrats, Mamdani holds a com-

manding lead, with 55 per cent backing him compared to Cuomo's 32 per cent. Sluiwa dominates among Republicans, with over two-thirds supporting him. Mamdani also leads among independent voters, though by a slimmer margin, 30 per cent, followed by Adams with 20 per cent. The Hill reported. Mamdani, a democratic socialist and State Assembly member, is the only candidate with a positive favourability rating in the poll, with 46 per cent favourable and 32 per cent unfavourable, a net positive of 14 points. In contrast, Cuomo has a net negative rating of 17

points, Adams 28 points, and Sluiwa 12 points, The Hill reported. With New York City's strong Democratic lean, Mamdani is widely seen as the favourite heading into November. Opponents are struggling to mount a viable challenge, in part due to the divided opposition. Cuomo has urged the other candidates to unite behind the one who polls best in a head-to-head matchup against Mamdani, a position polls currently suggest would favour him. However, both Adams and Sluiwa have stated they have no intention of dropping out.

PAKISTAN: PUBLIC HOSPITALS IN SINDH STRUGGLE UNDER MOUNTING CRISIS

SINDH: Public hospitals in Sindh, especially in Karachi, are facing a severe crisis marked by significant shortages of beds, ventilators, and medical personnel. This situation places both residents and patients arriving from different parts of the province in critical conditions, according to a report from The Express Tribune (TBT). The major hospitals in the city have a total of only 6,500 beds and 250 ventilators, along with a continuous lack of doctors and medical staff, leaving them poorly equipped to manage even the current local patient volume. A resident shared her struggle to arrange gall-bladder surgery for her husband at Jinnah Hospital. "I worked tirelessly for two weeks trying to get a bed for my husband, but without success. Patients from disadvantaged backgrounds endure long waits for admission at government hospitals, which causes them significant difficulties in receiving treatment," she was quoted as saying in the TBT report.

Pakistan's trade deficit soars 44 per cent in July, raising economic concerns

ISLAMABAD : Pakistan's trade deficit surged by a staggering 44 per cent in July, driven by a sharp increase in imports, raising fresh concerns about the country's economic situation, which is already in a crisis. The Express Tribune reported. According to The Express Tribune, Pakistan's Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal attempted to downplay the development, calling it a "temporary dip," and claimed it would be offset by future export growth tied to rising imports of raw materials. Speaking at the launch of the Pakistani government's first monthly development report for fiscal year 2025-26, Iqbal insisted that Pakistan's exporters could benefit from preferential US tariff rates, but only if they managed to enter global markets, something that remains uncertain. As per The Express Tribune, the spike in the deficit, reported by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), pushed the trade gap to USD 2.7 billion in July, up 44 per cent from the same month last year. This increase comes as the government slashed import duties in line with conditions from the International
